#### UGLY WILD BILL'S INDIAN VILLAGE AND ZOO

Practically every small town has its 'colorful' and memorable characters and Hobe Sound/Gomez is no exception. In the late 1920s, William 'Bill' Meredith, from Ohio, operated an efficient, reliable gasoline station and garage on Federal Highway, 10-12 miles south of Stuart. However, in 1937 William's business would have a whole new aspect to attract people from miles around and not just for auto service.

On December 10, 1937, Bill and wife, Bessie, officially opened a small 'tourist' attraction, the Seminole Indian Village and Zoo. There was nothing quite like it in Martin County, considered by some to be one of the largest such attractions in all of Florida at the time. The site included sideless thatched roofed chickees representing an authentic Seminole Indian camp, with 2 men, 2 women and 12 children. The 'chief' was Richard "Bird" Osceola, the great-grandson of the notable Seminole leader who fought in the Seminole Wars of the 1800s.

Tourists seemed to enjoy watching the daily routine of these American Natives preparing meals or sewing colorful clothing. A real exciting treat for the audience was witnessing Richard Osceola, a strong, 215 lb. man, wrestle a huge, flesh-eating alligator, then perform a technique to harmlessly lull the reptile to sleep, usually accomplished by flipping it over and gently rubbing the stomach.

The 'gator, known as 'Charlie' had previously been in an enclosed pen at Ward's Camp in Jensen Beach for years until Richard and Bill 'captured' the cantankerous animal to be displayed at the zoo, not an easy task. After arriving in Jensen, where the reptile was caged, Osceola, dressed in a colorful shirt, orange neckerchief and black cowboy hat, lassoed the wriggling, kicking alligator after several attempts, then dragged it out of the pen into an open area.

With an amazed crowd who had gathered to see the spectacle, the brave Seminole tried to grasp the angry 'gator's jaws to close its mouth and then safely jump on the beast's back, but unexpectedly he flipped around, as the sharp teeth severely gouged Richard's right hand in the process. Determined to succeed, with blood dripping from the wound, Osceola managed to rope-tie the agitated animal. He and Bill then lifted the heavy reptile onto the back of a tow truck, returning to Meredith's zoo at the filling station in Hobe Sound/Gomez. Once there, Charlie was removed from the vehicle, but a sudden powerful snap of the tail catapulted Richard across the road! Eventually the alligator was subdued enough to be contained safely and securely in a cage.

# **American Flag Facts**

- The origin of the first American flag is unknown. Some historians believe it
  was designed by New Jersey Congressman Francis Hopkinson and sewn by
  Philadelphia seamstress Betsy Ross.
- Between 1777 and 1960 Congress passed several acts that changed the shape, design and arrangement of the flag and allowed stars and stripes to be added to reflect the admission of each new state.
- Today the flag consists of 13 horizontal stripes, seven red alternating with six white. The stripes represent the original 13 Colonies and the stars represent the 50 states of the Union. The colors of the flag are symbolic as well; red symbolizes hardiness and valor, white symbolizes purity and innocence, and blue represents vigilance, perseverance and justice.
- In July 1969, the American flag was "flown" in space when Neil Armstrong placed it on the moon. Flags were placed on the lunar surface on each of six manned landings during the Apollo program.
